

JESUS PREPARES HIS DISCIPLES FOR AN ASSIGNMENT

(*Capernaum, Galilee*) — After he had asked twelve men to be his special followers, Jesus told them it was time for them to go out on an assignment. He wanted to send them out to all the towns around Capernaum to tell the people about God and Jesus, and how much God loves them.

The twelve men that Jesus sent were named Simon Peter, Andrew, James, John, Philip, Bartholomew, Thomas, Matthew, James (there were two named James), Thaddaeus, Simon the Patriot, and Judas Iscariot.

Jesus sent the twelve disciples out because there were too many people to reach and he could not reach all of them. He knew many people wanted to learn everything they could about God's kingdom. Everywhere he went the crowds were big and people asked good questions. So he sent the twelve out. He told them to teach the same things he was teaching. And he gave them power to heal people's diseases.

Jesus told the twelve to say, "God's kingdom is near! Good news!"

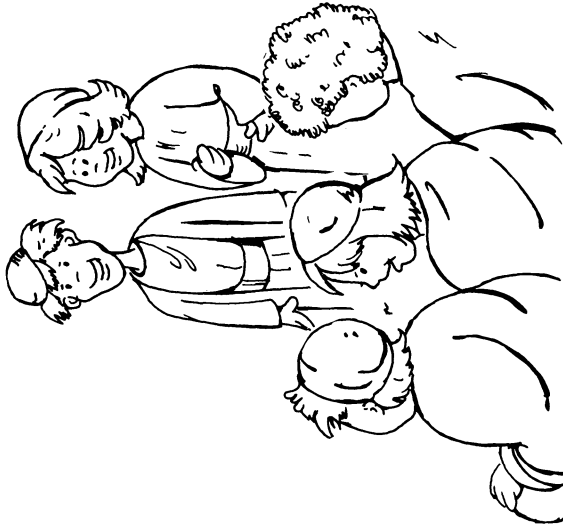
